Adding Subordinate Clauses to Sentences

Using the sentence from yesterday's lesson, add some more information, using subordinate clauses and a variety of punctuation (, -; :).

Key:

red – fronted adverbial (extra information – NOT an independent clause)

blue – independent clause (makes sense by itself)
green – subordinate clauses (2 – separated by commas)

E.g. At the time, he came from a wealthy, well-connected family, they supported his ambitions, of becoming a writer.

- 1. Now, choose 5 sentences from yesterday's Biography, on C.C Moore the poet.
- 2. Include a 'fronted adverbial' for each sentence.
- 3. Then extend the sentence by adding a subordinate clause/or clauses (this depends on how much information you can think of and want to include.
- 4. make sure you read your sentences back through to make sure they make sense.
