Activity 2: Five cheeky monkeys 🚑 or 💵





Objective

• Subtract within 5

Resources

Five Cheeky Monkeys - see page 390 in the Rhymes and Songs section

What to do



- Display: the Tree tool showing five monkeys in one tree.
- Sing Five Cheeky Monkeys together with the class. At the appropriate place in the song, encourage the children to make an alligator 'snap' with their arms, while you remove one monkey from the tree.
- Put all five monkeys back in the tree and ask: How many monkeys are in the tree? Ask a few children and then check by counting together.
- Say: The alligator comes close and two monkeys run away! Remove two monkeys from the board. Ask: How many monkeys are left?
- Choose a child to answer (3) and confirm that there are three monkeys left. Say: There were five monkeys and two ran away. So that leaves three monkeys in the tree. Five take away two leaves three.
- Position four monkeys in the tree and ask the children to count them. Say: There are four monkeys in the tree. Alligator comes close and one monkeys runs away. Ask: How many are left? Hold up the same number of fingers to show me.
- Ask the children to answer (3) and ask: How many monkeys were there to start? (4) How many monkeys ran away? (1) How many monkeys are left? (3) Say: Four take away one leaves three.
- Continue in this way to illustrate subtraction facts up to 5, explaining each stage of the calculation as necessary.
- If appropriate, extend beyond five monkeys.
