# Money problems

## Lesson objective

• Solve problems involving money

#### Previous related lessons

#### Prerequisites for learning

Pupils need to:

- recognise and identify 1p, 2p, 5p, 10p, 20p, 50p and £1 coins
- know the value of 1p, 2p, 5p, 10p, 20p, 50p and £1 coins
- find equivalent ways of making the same values (up to 50p)
- add and subtract numbers within 20

#### Vocabulary

zero, one, two ... one hundred, pence, penny, money, coin

#### **Future related lessons**

None

#### Success criteria

Pupils can:

- add two or more prices together and work out the value
- give change from 10p for items less than 10p
- find the coins required to pay for total amounts

# Getting Started

• Choose an activity from Measurement (money).


## Teach

#### Resources

mini whiteboard, pen and eraser (per pair)



- Display: Slide 1 showing the shop and items.
- Invite a child to come and 'buy' two items from the shop.
- Say: [Name of child] has chosen two items. One costs [x] pence and the other costs [y] pence. Ask: How much do they cost together?
- Discuss answers and ask children to explain the methods they used to reach the answer.
- Ask: What coins could we use to pay for these? Draw the coins you would use on your boards.
- Discuss answers and highlight different ways of making the same amount.
- Repeat the above several times by asking different children to come up and choose different items.
- Move on to demonstrating how you would give change from a 10p or 20p coin based on the
  cost of two items. Use the method that children are familiar with to demonstrate the subtraction
  on the board.
- Repeat with other items chosen.

# Plenary

### Resources

selection of items with price tags (each price up to 10p) (per class); mini whiteboard, pen and eraser (per pair)



- Show children the items with the price tags.
- Choose two items and ask: How much money would I need to buy both of these items?
- Discuss answers.
- Say: I have a 20p coin. How much change will I get if I use it to buy these items?
- Repeat with different items. Check children's strategies for adding and subtracting.
